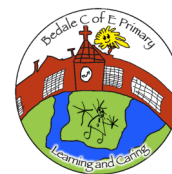

Dear Parents/Carers

Reception News

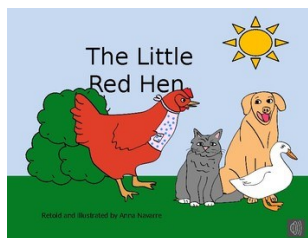
The pupils had a visit from Farmer Mark with his tractor last week. He told them all about harvesting crops and farming the land.

APPLYING FOR A PRIMARY SCHOOL PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2019

The application window is now open to apply for a primary place for September 2019. The information you need to apply for a primary school place is available at:

www.northyorks.gov.uk/school-admissions. You will need to:-

- Create an account via the parent portal. You will then receive a verification email
- Log back into your account to add your child and your school preference
- Remember to review and submit your application, you will then receive an email acknowledgement to confirm they have received your application.
