PARKING/WAC DROP OFF



The need to knows:


- We will start at 8.45 on the back yard on Wednesday 7th February.

EYFS NEWS

In Early Years we are really proud of the rich experiences we give the children and we strive to make their learning real and fun.

Enrichment activities are planned out across the year and involve regular visits into the community for various different reasons.

This week we have visited the Dales Centre as part of our learning around friendships in our 'Chinese New Year' topic. In China they believe that their community is more important than themselves and we used our visit to

demonstrate what good friendships we have in our community. We decorated cakes to share with the adults who

access this service, and took along books to read together. It was a lovely morning and the adults there were absolutely thrilled to see us again. We invited them to our 'Chinese Party' this week and we enjoyed showing them our dances, singing and poems.



YEAR ONE NEWS

Year 1 have had a lovely week exploring their new story Meerkat Mail by Emily Gravett by writing their own postcards pretending to be Sunny who has visited Bedale. The children wrote **how** and **why** questions for one another to gather ideas on what Sunny could have done during his holiday, some of the children decided that he went swimming, visited Bedale Primary school and even had a trip to Big Sheep Little Cow! The children also enjoyed creating their own animal riddles using their knowledge of animal groups, animal features and what animals eat. Here are some super examples

"I have feathers, I have 2 legs and wings and I am pink. What am I?" by Jack.

"I can slither on the floor, I have scales and I stick out my tongue. I am a reptile with no legs. What am I?" by Evelyn.

The children had a wonderful surprise last week when we were able to use our animal knowledge for an animal we have all seen or even have at home, with a great visit from Dogs Trust! We learnt the 5 happy dog rules including:

1. When a dog is eating, leave them alone.
2. When a dog is resting, leave them alone
3. Dogs don't like hugs, they like strokes.
4. Always keep quiet near a dog
5. When a dog takes your toy, tell an adult.

We can't wait to keep learning more about animals both local and exotic!



YEAR TWO NEWS

Since starting year 2, the children have had so many wonderful experiences. We kicked off the year with Farmer's Day where we had a visit from Farmer Pete and he talked to the children about the importance of farming, where our food comes from, and they got the chance to plant their own bean seed. Using our knowledge of healthy and unhealthy foods, the children created their own salad as part of their DT lesson. In English, we retold the story of 'The Runaway Chapatti' and shared these with parents, the children did a wonderful job! Year 2 also had a visit to Fountains Abbey where we learnt all about the life of monks and the history of the place, we loved exploring the ruins. Mrs Eldridge came to talk to us about Mettupalayam and what their life is like there. We finished off the term showcasing our fantastic talent in our Christmas Showcase, where the children, danced, sang songs, and performed using sign language. They were brilliant!



We have so much to look forward to this year, for example our artist visit in Spring, our visit to the synagogue and a visit from a vintage fire engine.

YEAR THREE NEWS

Last term Year three had lots of exciting opportunities as part of our enrichment programme. One of our highlights was leading the Harvest festival in St Gregory's and we were so proud of how many children volunteered to speak in front of the whole church.

As part of our history work we found out about the schools in Bedale and what schools were like in the past. Did you know that the church office building used to be a school? We couldn't believe how small it was! We also looked at the old school building on Wycar and compared them to our school and the other schools in Bedale such as Mowbray and the High School. We also had a lesson where we found out what it would have been like to be in a Victorian school. The children weren't sure about working in dim lighting and writing lines and they definitely didn't like the idea of the cane as a punishment!



We have several exciting opportunities coming up straight after half term. Towards the end of the term, we learned about the charity, WaterAid, and enjoyed a visit from Adele Eldridge who explained more about water and the challenges people who live in Mettupalayam face to have access to clean water.



This term we have already researched, planned and made our own spring rolls using a variety of ingredients following a taste test session. We had so much fun preparing and cooking our ingredients using a pan. Everyone said school smelt delicious!

We are very much looking forward to being French shop keepers soon; buying and selling fruit at our class French fruit market and using our super French pronunciation of the varied, new vocabulary we have learnt.



how far we've come.
