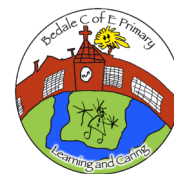

SAFEGUARDING

On Friday 29th September, we are lucky enough to have a company called Parent Zone deliver an assembly to pupils in Year 3,4,5 and 6 on internet awareness on behalf of Google. These assemblies highlight issues of internet use/awareness in a way that is both educational and entertaining including the use of passwords, protecting digital profiles, the dangers of oversharing images and the importance of being kind on-line. We continue to work hard to ensure children know how to keep themselves safe.

On a similar theme, over the past two weeks some of our Year 6 pupils have taken part in Bikeability which promotes keeping our pupils safe on the road.

“Over the last two weeks some of the year six pupils have taken part in the Bikeability Cycling course, led by different instructors from NYCC. The children initially were taught on the playground but then went onto Firby Road to practise road safety on their bikes. We really enjoyed the experience and have learnt many more valuable road safety skills as well as becoming more confident on the roads with other traffic around us! The instructors were really helpful as well, they made us confident on the road and at the end gave written feedback on things we needed to improve on. A great experience”!

However, there may be exceptional circumstances when the school will discuss concerns with Social Care and/or the Police without parental knowledge (in accordance with Child Protection procedures). CAR PARKING—FIRBY ROAD AND BENKHILL DRIVE

Please can we ask parents/carers to be considerate when parking your car before and after school when dropping off/picking up. We have had several complaints from residents whose drive ways have been blocked by parked cars. Please also DO NOT PARK ON OR OPPOSITE the yellow 'Keep Clear' road markings. In addition please do not park near junctions as this blocks the view of cars trying to exit from them.

ATTENDANCE

Over the past three years our attendance at Bedale Primary School has been consistently good—at over 96% and we hope to continue to keep it that way.

Thank you to all parents and carers for working with us to achieve such a high standard. We have much to celebrate already this year.

We have been really impressed with those few children that had low attendance last year who have significantly improved it already.

LATENESS

Lateness has also improved considerably over the last six months. Thank you to both pupils and parents who have worked hard to improve all of the above.

Only 1.8% of our pupils have been late to school. What a fantastic start!

Just remember.....being late adds up to loss of learning:

5 minutes late every day adds up to 3 days lost each year

10 minutes late adds up to 6 days lost each year

15 minutes late adds up to 10 days lost each year

20 minutes late adds up to 13 days lost each year

30 minutes late adds up to 19 days lost each year
