
Well done to Ben Croft who last week was awarded second 'Top Wicket Taker' for North Yorkshire for the Under 10s!

Year 3/4 News

In year 3, we have been learning lots about the United kingdom and have created a non-chronological report all about the UK using paragraphs and subheadings. The presentation of work is

brilliant. This has linked really well with our topic sessions where we have been learning more about how the land is used in the UK. The children's hard work continues as we have started using bar models in maths to represent and work out addition and subtraction problems.

Thank you to all those who contributed and attended our Harvest service last week. The children who read did a marvellous job.

In Year 4 the children have all worked hard to write their own version of the myth 'Icarus'. They used powerful verbs and exciting vocabulary to make their stories as enjoyable as possible! In maths we continue to work hard on learning our times tables.

We look forward to seeing you at parents evening so you can see the fantastic work that the children have produced so far.

Year 5 enjoyed their visit from Yorkshire Water on Monday 7th October to talk about the work of Water Aid around the

world. We enjoyed learning about the VIP (Ventilated Improved Toilet) and how the charity helps people who don't have access to clean, safe water. In the fortnight since the visit we have been learning more about the work of Water Aid and writing about it. We will be sharing this work with our paired classes later in the term. After half-term we have another visit to school with the Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust coming with their mobile classroom to help us learn even more about rivers and their features.

In Year 6, we have been learning more about the rainforest. We've written poems about their beauty and now we are researching some of the important issues that are associated with them. In Science we have been using classification keys to sort a variety of little-known amphibians—it was quite a tricky task but between us we managed it. We look forward to meeting you all at parents evening next week and discussing your child's progress.
