We have had a productive couple of weeks.

Our years 4 and 5 were fortunate to begin the half term with a workshop to explore the religion of Hinduism, and some Indian traditions, to coincide with recent Diwali celebrations. Our guests, Mrs Singh and Mrs Kaur, transformed a classroom with beautiful, vibrant decorations, which acted as a back drop to the dramatisation of the story of Rama and Sita. The children took part in the story, bringing the characters alive and helping them understand the origin of the festival of lights, all whilst Mrs Kaur prepared a fantastic feast for sharing. Arguably the highlight of the day, however, was the opportunity to adorn ourselves in traditional Indian clothes and learn some spectacular dance moves — a fantastic way to explore different celebrations in our wider community. It was certainly a day to remember, one which the children enjoyed enormously and will remember for years to come.

Our school disco was a great success and it was wonderful to see both discos so very well attended. The children's behaviour at both sessions was exceptional. I have told KS2 pupils it was the best disco I have been to in all my sixteen years here. The children were also absolutely brilliant in making as little mess as possible. That brings me on to some news to share. Mr McBeath will be leaving us shortly. He has been successful in gaining a post as site supervisor at a larger secondary school. 
# THE SUN NEWSPAPER—BOOKS FOR SCHOOLS
