

Year 6 News



We recently received some incredibly inspiring news about a previous pupil of Bedale Primary School, Josh Coburn. Josh was a pupil in MrsTurnbull's final class before she became headteacher

(her classroom was where Mrs Brown now teaches, with Mr Collins as her teaching assistant).
